The Island Eco Tour is a 4 hour interactive tour that provides you knowledge of this fascinating island, offering an outline of Atiu's flora, birds and topography. Well-known and respected by the locals and tourists alike, Birdman George will take you on an expedition through the forests, boasting a dramatic variation of bush and splendid landscapes where only these exotic native birds can be found. He will also show you the coastal areas of the island that is bordered by spectacular beaches.

Learn about the island through its rich culture and history, people and traditions, and explore the natural surroundings of the island. Take a scenic walk through the hidden trails, allowing you an informative tour through nature's best. Light refreshments are offered at the end of the tour on a privately secluded beach for a small tropical lunch. The Kakerori or Rarotonga flycatcher is endemic to the Cook Islands. In December 2002, the first two Kakerori nestlings were sighted and by September 2003 a total of four fledglings were found.
